



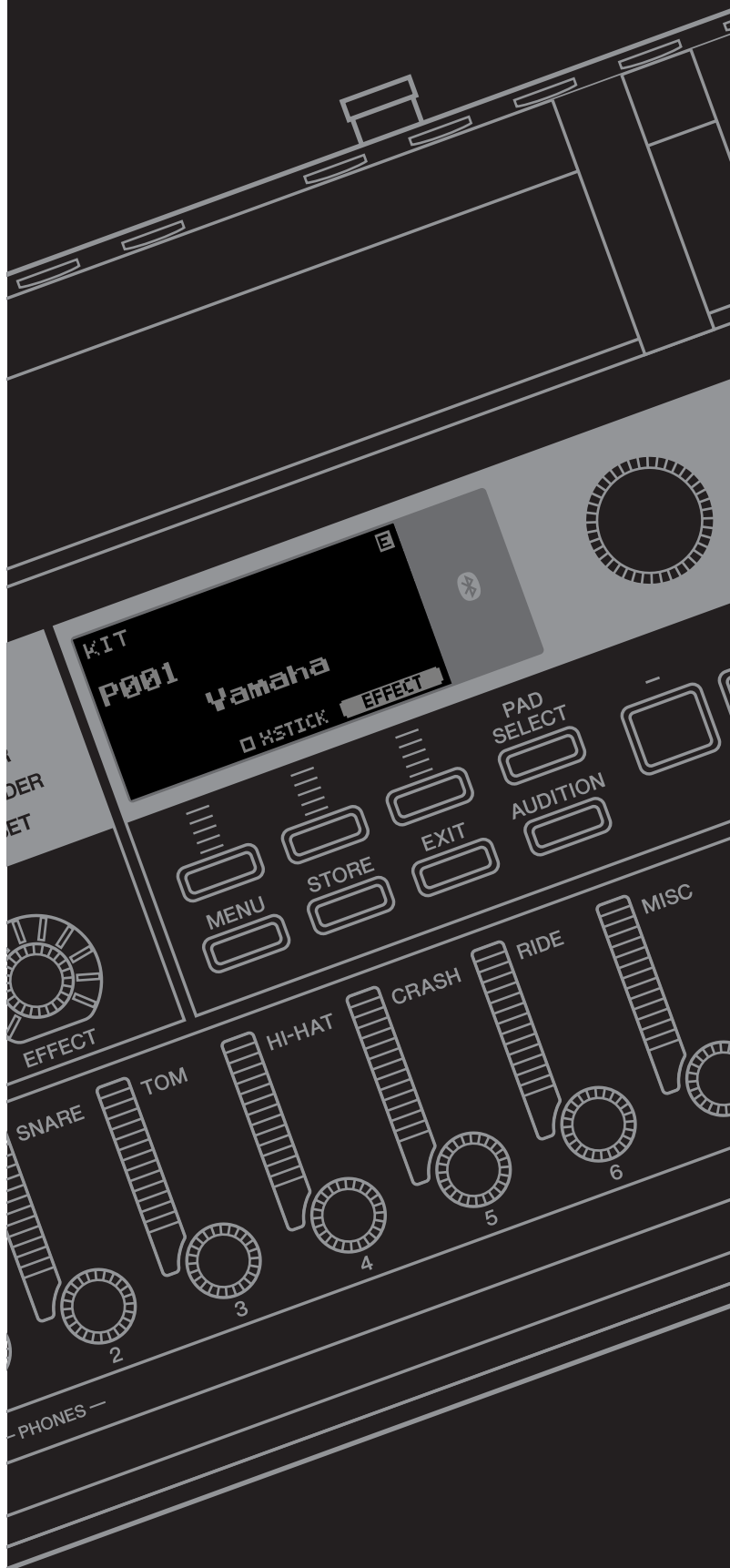

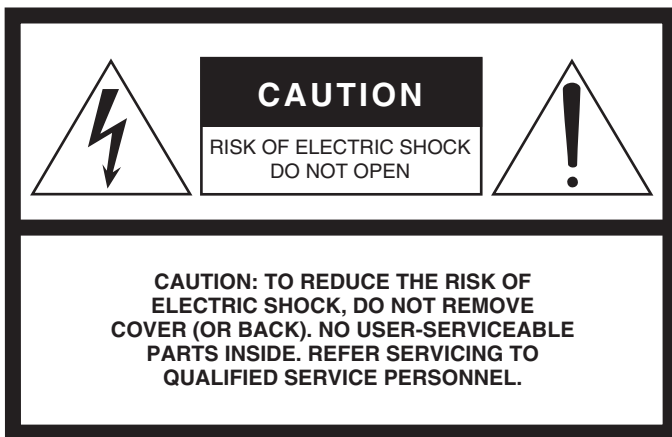

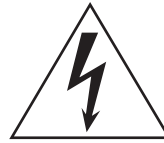

# PRECAUTIONS

## For the AC adaptor

### **WARNING**

- This AC adaptor is designed for use with only Yamaha electronic instruments. Do not use for any other purpose.
- Indoor use only. Do not use in any wet environments.

### **CAUTION**

- When setting up, make sure that the AC outlet is easily accessible. If some trouble or malfunction occurs, immediately turn off the power switch of the instrument and disconnect the AC adaptor from the outlet. When the AC adaptor is connected to the AC outlet, keep in mind that electricity is flowing at the minimum level, even if the power switch is turned off. When you are not using the instrument for a long time, make sure to unplug the power cord from the wall AC outlet.

## For DTX-PROX

### **WARNING**

Always follow the basic precautions listed below to avoid the possibility of serious injury or even death from electrical shock, short-circuiting, damages, fire or other hazards. These precautions include, but are not limited to, the following:

#### Power supply/AC adaptor

- Do not place the power cord near heat sources such as heaters or radiators. Also, do not excessively bend or otherwise damage the cord, or place heavy objects on it.
- Only use the voltage specified as correct for the instrument. The required voltage is printed on the name plate of the instrument.
- Use the specified adaptor (page 60) only. Using the wrong adaptor can result in damage to the instrument or overheating.
- Check the electric plug periodically and remove any dirt or dust which may have accumulated on it.

#### Do not open

- This instrument contains no user-serviceable parts. Do not open the instrument or attempt to disassemble or modify the internal components in any way. If it should appear to be malfunctioning, discontinue use immediately and have it inspected by qualified Yamaha service personnel.

#### Water warning

- Do not expose the instrument to rain, use it near water or in damp or wet conditions, or place on it any containers (such as vases, bottles or glasses) containing liquids which might spill into any openings. ## **CAUTION**

### **Power supply/AC adaptor**

- Do not connect the instrument to an electrical outlet using a multiple-connector. Doing so can result in lower sound quality, or possibly cause overheating in the outlet.
- When removing the electric plug from the instrument or an outlet, always hold the plug itself and not the cord. Pulling by the cord can damage it.
- Remove the electric plug from the outlet when the instrument is not to be used for extended periods of time, or during electrical storms.

### **Assembly**

- Take care when setting up cables. If anyone were to trip on a cable, the instrument could topple over and cause injury.

### **Connections**


- Before connecting the instrument to other electronic components, turn off the power for all components. Before turning the power on or off for all components, set all volume levels to minimum.
- Be sure to set the volumes of all components at their minimum levels and gradually raise the volume controls while playing the instrument to set the desired listening level.

### **Handling caution**

- Do not insert a finger or hand in any gaps on the instrument.
- Never insert or drop paper, metallic, or other objects into the gaps on the panel. This could cause physical injury to you or others, damage to the instrument or other property, or operational failure.
- Do not rest your weight on, or place heavy objects on the instrument, and do not use excessive force on the buttons, switches or connectors.
- Keep small parts out of the reach of infants. Your children may accidentally swallow them.
- Do not use the instrument/device or headphones for a long period of time at a high or uncomfortable volume level, since this can cause permanent hearing loss. If you experience any hearing loss or ringing in the ears, consult a physician.

## Installing the DTX-PROX

First, install the DTX-PROX.

There are three different ways of installation as shown below.

- Attach the DTX-PROX onto the rack of your drum kit. (For more information, refer to the Assembly Manual.)
- Use the included module holder (page 6) to attach the standard drum hardware. (See “Integrating Electronic & Acoustic Drums” on page 53.)
- Place on a flat surface

After installing the DTX-PROX, connect cables to the Pads. For more information on the connections, refer to the specific Assembly Manual of your drum kit.

## ■ Connecting the AC adaptor

### ⚠ WARNING

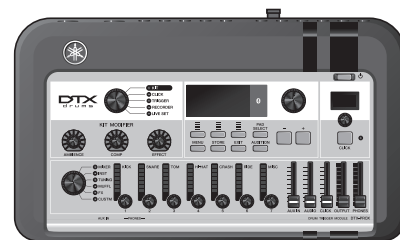
Only use the specified AC adaptor (page 60). Using a different AC adaptor can cause malfunction, overheating, fire, and other problems. This may void the warranty so please take careful note.

### ⚠ CAUTION

Locate the DTX-PROX close to an AC outlet. If you notice any abnormalities during operation, turn the power off immediately and unplug the AC adaptor.

1. Make sure that the power is turned off (all panel lights and the screen backlight are off).

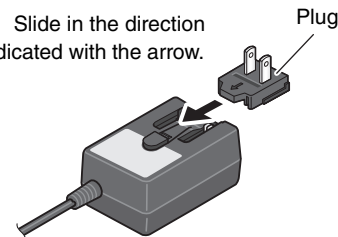


2. For removable plug type AC adaptors only: Make sure that the plug is not disconnected.

### ⚠ WARNING

- For AC adaptors with a removable plug, only use the AC adaptor with the plug attached, and keep the plug. Plugging only the plug into the power outlet can cause electric shock or fire.
- If the removable plug comes off from the AC adaptor, avoid touching the metal parts on the plug and slide the AC adaptor onto the plug until you hear it lock on to the adaptor with a click. Also, make sure you keep any foreign objects out of the plug. This can cause electrical shock, short circuit, or failure.

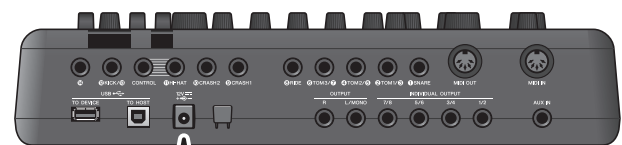

When you turn on your DTX-PROX for the first time, the Initial Setup page will be displayed. On this page, you will be required to specify the following. When you specify the model number, the DTX-PROX will automatically optimize the trigger output levels for all of your pads.

1. Identify your drum kit using the [-][+] controllers and press the button below “OK” ([F3]).

Your drum kit’s model number is indicated on the Assembly Manual for your drum kit. Make sure to select the proper pad type (DTX\*\*K-~~X~~ or DTX\*\*K-~~M~~) for your particular drum kit.

2. When the confirmation screen appears, press the button below “YES” ([F1]).

When the initial setting is complete, the KIT screen appears.

## Changing the Overall Settings

### ■ Auto Power-Off

The Auto Power-Off function automatically turns off the DTX-PROX after a certain period of inactivity. The factory default is set at 30 minutes.

#### NOTICE

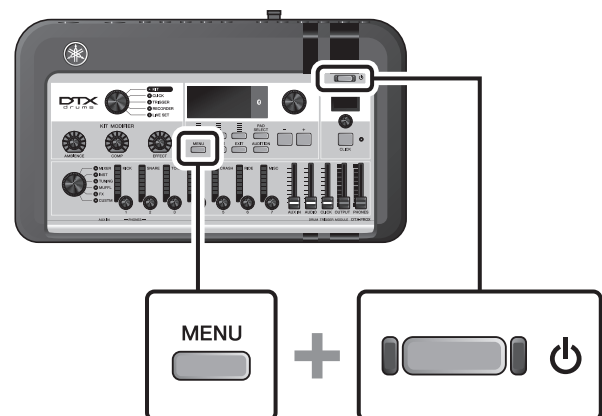
- Unsaved data is lost when the DTX-PROX is turned off with the Auto Power-Off function. Always store data before turning the power off.
- In certain modes of operation, the Auto Power-Off function will not turn off the DTX-PROX when the set time has elapsed. So we recommend that you always turn off the DTX-PROX manually when you are finished using it.
- If you expect the DTX-PROX to be inactive for a certain length of time while connected to external audio equipment or a PA, we recommend fully lowering the volume on the external equipment. Alternatively, you can disable the Auto Power-Off function to ensure that the DTX-PROX stays on.

#### NOTE

To set the Auto Power-Off to a time other than 30 minutes, access the setting from the [MENU] button. (MENU/Utility/General)

### ● Auto Power-Off Quick Cancel

First, make sure that the DTX-PROX is turned off. Then, while holding down the [MENU] button, press the [⏻] (Standby/On) button to cancel the Auto Power-Off function. The function will remain off until you set a new Auto Power-Off time.



### ■ Restoring DTX-PROX Settings to the Factory Defaults (Factory Reset)

Use the Factory Reset function to restore the DTX-PROX's settings to their factory defaults, even if you have accidentally overwritten them.

#### NOTICE

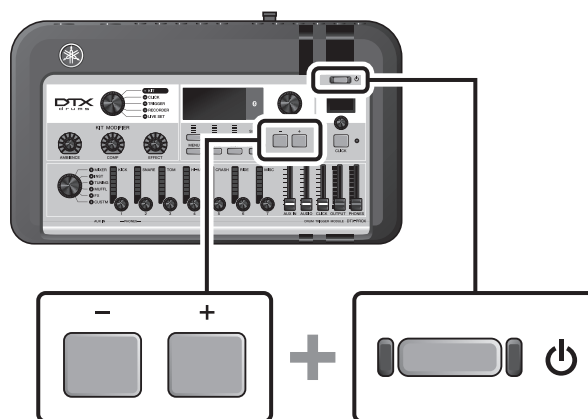
A factory reset overwrites any settings you have made with the corresponding factory defaults. Save any important user-defined data to a USB flash drive before carrying out a factory reset. For more information, refer to the Reference Manual (PDF). (MENU/File)

### ● Performing a Factory Reset

First, make sure that the DTX-PROX is turned off. Then, while holding down the [-] and [+] buttons, press the [⏻] (Standby/On) button to perform the Factory Reset function.

### ■ Connecting a USB Flash Drive to the DTX-PROX

#### Precautions When Using the [USB TO DEVICE] Terminal

When connecting a USB flash drive to the [USB TO DEVICE] terminal, be sure to follow the important precautions below.

**NOTE**

For more information about the handling of USB flash drives, refer to the owner's manual of your USB flash drive.

### ● Compatible USB Devices

#### USB flash drives only

**NOTE**

- Other USB devices such as USB hub, mouse, computer keyboard, cannot be used.
- A USB cable cannot be used to connect a USB device to the [USB TO DEVICE] terminal.

**NOTICE**

The rating of the [USB TO DEVICE] terminal is a maximum of 5 V / 500 mA. Do not connect USB devices having a rating above this, since this can cause damage to the instrument itself.

### ● Connecting a USB Flash Drive

When connecting a USB device to the [USB TO DEVICE] terminal, make sure that the connector on the DTX-PROX is appropriate and that it is connected in the proper direction.

Although USB devices 2.0 to 3.0 can be used on the DTX-PROX, the amount of time for saving to or loading from the USB device may differ depending on the type of data or the status of the instrument.

**NOTICE**

- **Avoid connecting or disconnecting the USB device during playback/recording and file management operations (such as Save, Copy, Delete, and Format), or when accessing the USB device. Failure to observe this may result in "freezing" of the operation of the instrument or corruption of the USB device and the data.**
- **When connecting then disconnecting the USB device (and vice versa), make sure to wait a few seconds between the two operations.**

#### ● Formatting the USB Flash Drive

Some USB flash drives should be formatted with this instrument before they can be used. For information on how to format the USB flash drive, refer to the Reference Manual (PDF). (MENU/File/Format)

**NOTICE**

The format operation erases any previously existing data. Make sure that the USB flash drive you are formatting does not contain any important data.

#### ● To Protect Your Data (Write Protection)

To prevent important data from being inadvertently erased, write-protect the USB flash drive. When you are saving data to the USB flash drive, make sure you disable the write-protect first.

## Using Smart Devices

Connecting a smart device to the [USB TO HOST] jack establishes a digital connection and allows you to:

- **Record and play back high-quality audio using apps**
- **Practice, record (both audio and video), and share your recordings on social networks using Rec'n'Share**

### **NOTICE**

- **Before connecting devices, make sure the volume levels on all external devices are set at their minimum.**
- **Be sure to place your smart device on a stable surface to prevent it from falling over and being damaged.**

### **NOTE**

To eliminate the risk of interference due to noise by your smart device when used in combination with the DTX-PROX, turn on the Airplane Mode and then turn on Wi-Fi.

Additional parts are required for connecting a smart device.

## Listening to Audio Data from a Smart Device through the DTX-PROX (*Bluetooth* Audio Function)

### **Bluetooth capability**

Depending on the country in which you purchased the product, the DTX-PROX may not have *Bluetooth* capability. If the *Bluetooth* logo is shown or printed on the top panel, this means that the product is equipped with *Bluetooth* functionality.

**Before using the *Bluetooth* function, be sure to read “About *Bluetooth*” on page 4.**

You can input the sound of the audio data saved in a *Bluetooth*-equipped device, such as a smart phone or digital audio player, to the DTX-PROX and listen to it through the headphones or speakers connected to the DTX-PROX. The input audio data can be recorded. (page 46)

#### \* *Bluetooth*-equipped device

In this manual, “*Bluetooth*-equipped device” refers to a device that can transmit audio data on it to the DTX-PROX using the *Bluetooth* function, via wireless communication. (i.e., smart phones and portable audio players.)

#### NOTE

*Bluetooth* headphones or speakers cannot be connected.

## ■ Pairing with the *Bluetooth*-equipped device

To connect the *Bluetooth*-equipped device for the first time, the *Bluetooth*-equipped device and the DTX-PROX must be “paired.” Once the device and the DTX-PROX are paired, it is not necessary to pair the two again (unless you’ve disabled pairing).

### ● Pairing

“Pairing” means to register *Bluetooth*-equipped smart devices on the DTX-PROX and establish the mutual recognition for wireless communication between the two.

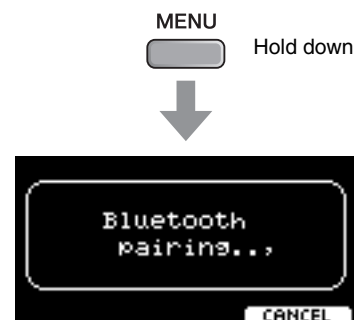
#### 1. Hold down the [MENU] button.


The screen appears while the device is being paired.

To cancel pairing, use the button below “CANCEL” ([F3]).

#### 2. Turn the *Bluetooth* setting ON on the *Bluetooth*-equipped device and select “DTX-PROX AUDIO” from the list.

- Make sure to complete the settings on the smart device within 5 minutes. After that, the pairing mode ends automatically.
- If you are required to enter a passkey, enter the numerals “0000.”



When the pairing completed, the  (*Bluetooth*) mark appears on top screen for each mode.

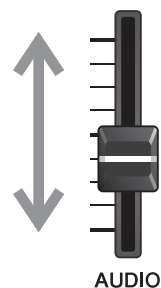


### 3. Play back audio data on the smart device to confirm that the headphones or speakers connected to the DTX-PROX can output the audio sound.

You can adjust the volume of the sound input via *Bluetooth* by the [AUDIO] slider.

When you turn on the DTX-PROX the next time, the last-connected smart device will be connected to the DTX-PROX automatically, if the *Bluetooth* function of the smart device and the DTX-PROX is set to on. If it is not connected automatically, select the model name of the instrument from the connection list on the smart device.

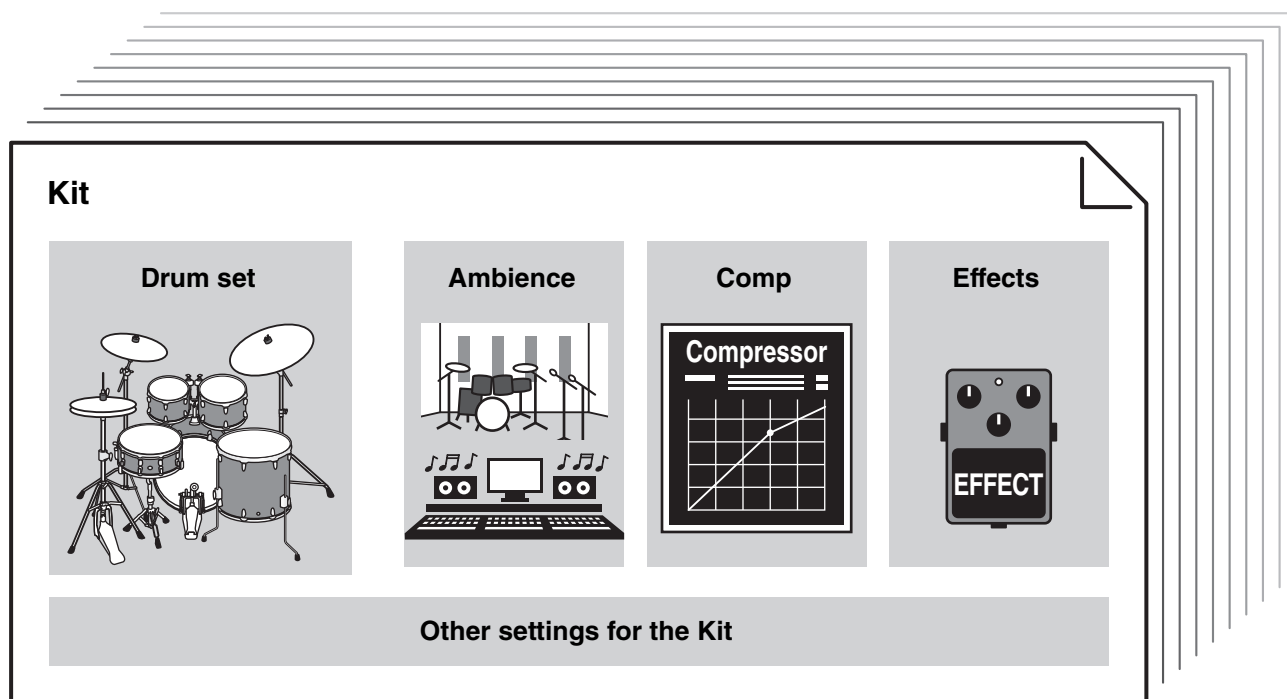

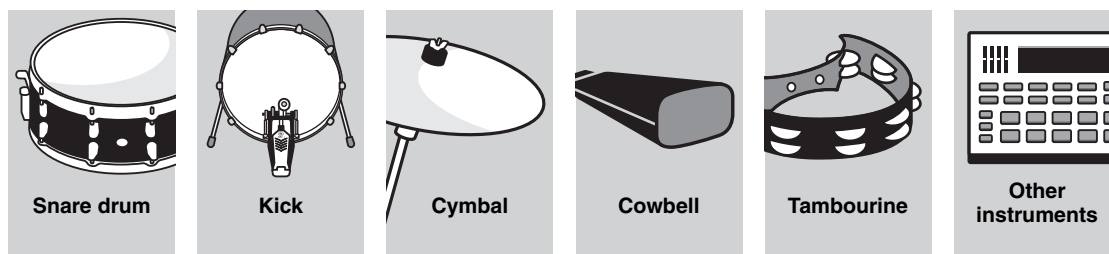
## Structure of the Kit

A Kit is a combination of drum set sounds and the sound modifier settings that enhance the sounds, such as Ambience, Comp (Compressor) and Effects. This drum trigger module contains numerous sets of preset kits, and you can change the drum set sounds by selecting another kit or by changing the sound modifier settings.



Each drum or percussion instrument in the drum set is called an instrument or "Inst," and you can play the Inst sounds by striking drum pads.







## Playing the Pads

To play the Inst sounds, strike the pads connected to the DTX-PROX.

You can play different sounds by striking different sections (or “Zones”) of the pad, depending on the number of zones available on the pad.

When position sensing is available, you can express a subtle nuance by striking different locations within a Zone.

## ■ Snare and Tom

Strike different sections of the pad in the same way you would play an acoustic snare drum or tom.

With the snare pad (the pad with position sensor connected to the [1 SNARE] jack), you can create natural tonal changes according to the location within the Zone.

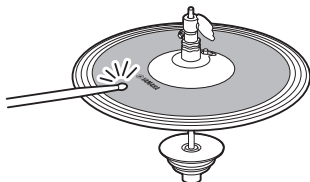

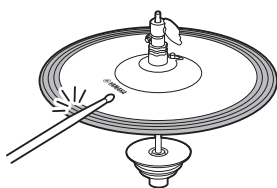

Striking the front side on the outer edge of the hi-hat pad produces an edge shot sound.

Make sure that the drumstick is parallel to the pad surface when striking the pad. The edge sensor switch on the cymbal pad may not react properly when the pad is struck completely from the side.

### Open/Close

- You can produce an open hi-hat sound by striking the hi-hat pad with the hi-hat pedal fully open.
- You can produce a closed hi-hat sound by striking the hi-hat pad with the hi-hat pedal fully pressed.
- Different hi-hat sound is produced depending on the how much the pedal is opened or pressed.

### Foot-close sounds

You can press down the hi-hat pedal to create a foot-close sound without having to strike the hi-hat pad.






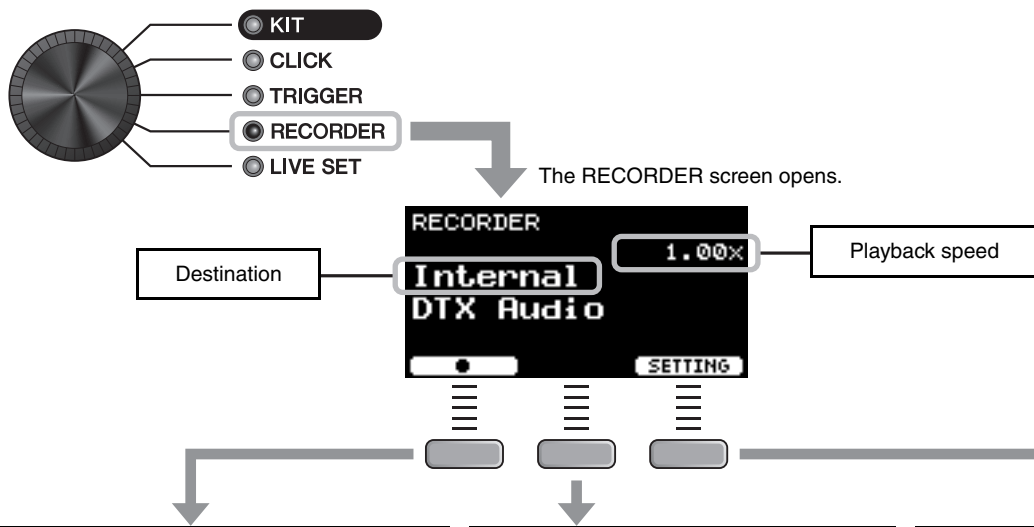
# Recording Your Performance

Use the DTX-PROX to record your performance. When a USB flash drive is connected to the DTX-PROX, audio is recorded to the USB flash drive.

You can overdub your performance onto an accompaniment song (input via the [AUX IN] jack or *Bluetooth*) and save your performance combined with the accompaniment song as a single audio file.

## ■ Recording to the DTX-PROX (when no USB flash drive is connected to the terminal)

# Using Live Sets

A Live Set is a combination of the Kit, tempo, audio files and other settings sequenced in the order you like. For example, you can create a chain of Kits in the order of a performance set list when playing live, or arrange a series of audio files in the order of difficulty level for use in your daily practice.

With the DTX-PROX, you can save up to 10 Live Sets, and use them anytime during your performance.

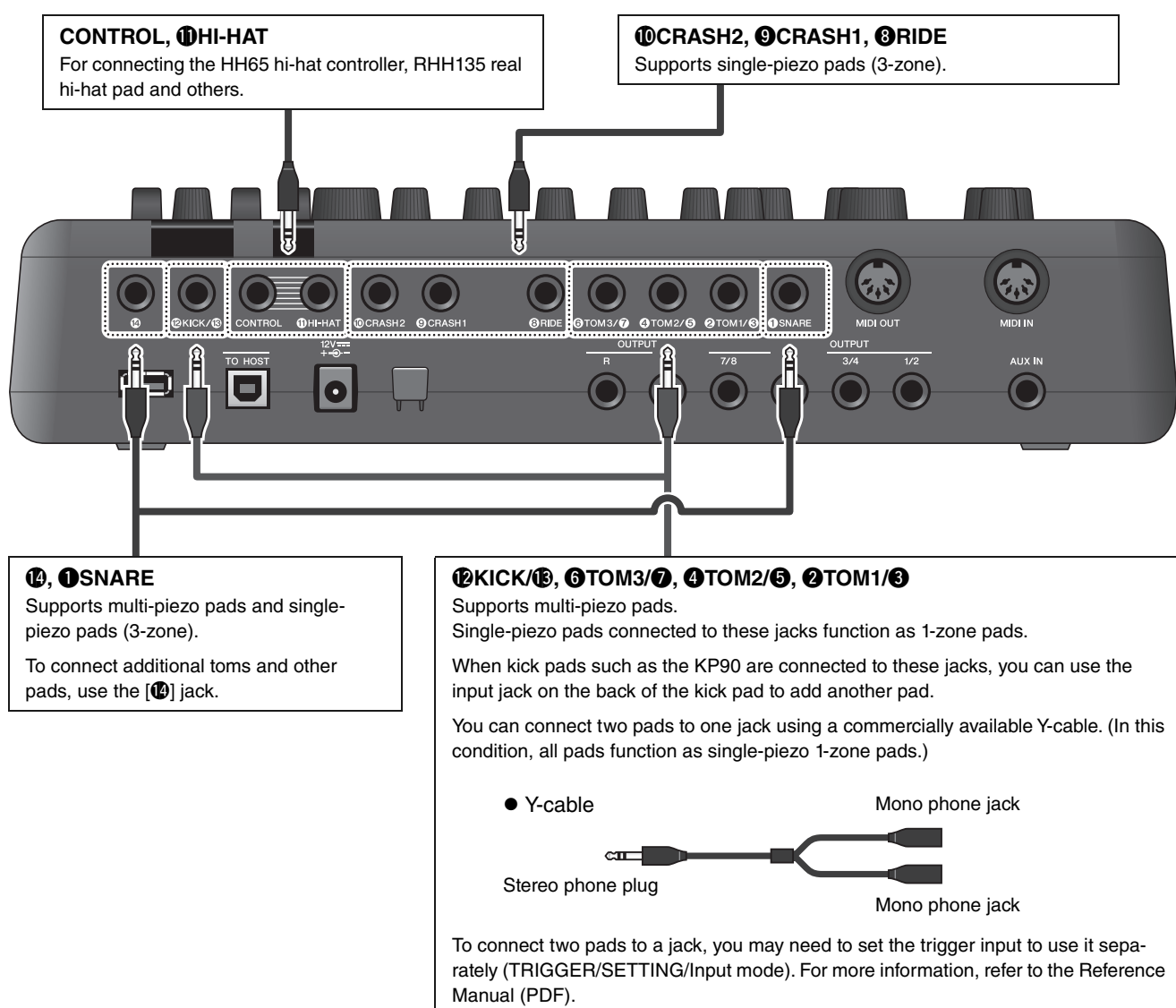

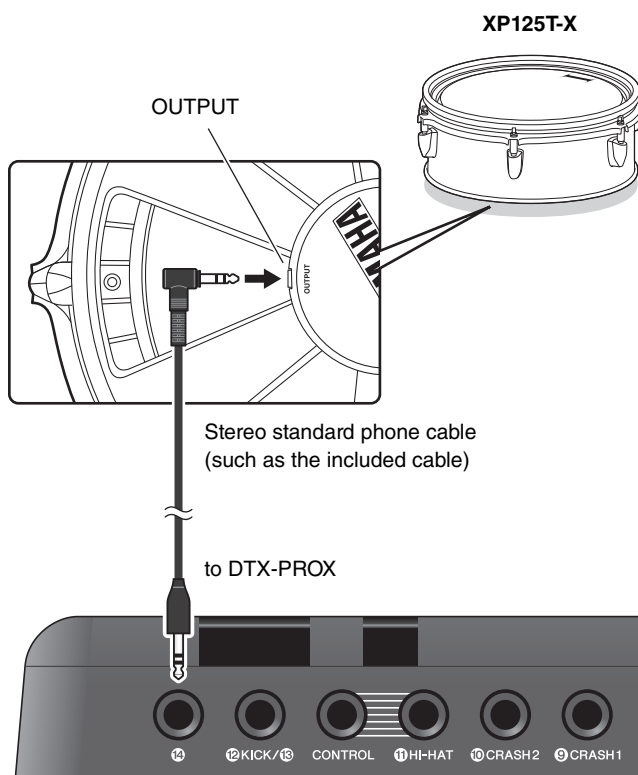

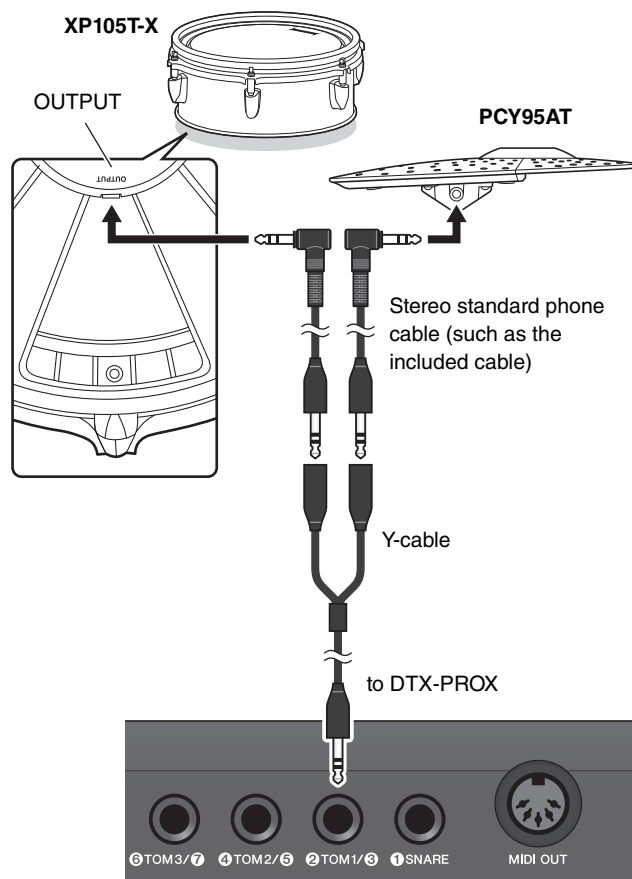

2. Connect a commercially available Y-cable and a pad to the [2TOM1/3] jack.



3. Turn on the drum trigger module.
4. Set the Pad Type to “PCY95AT.”  
 To split the trigger input, set the Input Mode to “separate.”  
 (TRIGGER/SETTING/input mode)



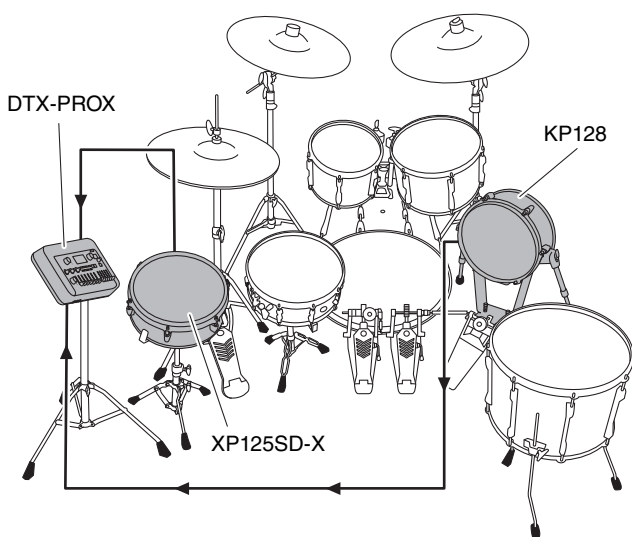
## ■ Integrating Electronic & Acoustic Drums

### ● Adding Pads to an Acoustic Drum Set

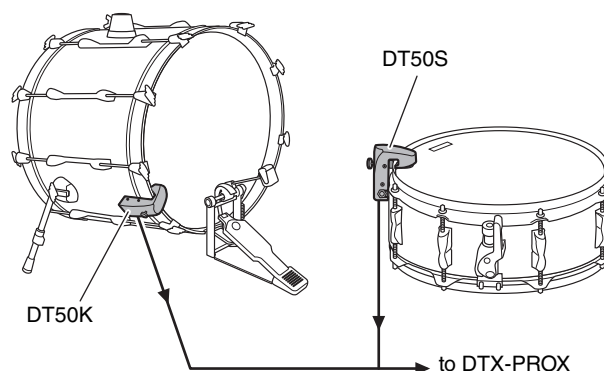
You can easily add a pad such as the XP125SD-X to an acoustic drum set. Set the proper Pad Type for the connected pad (TRIGGER/SETTING/Pad Type).

#### ● Typical setup



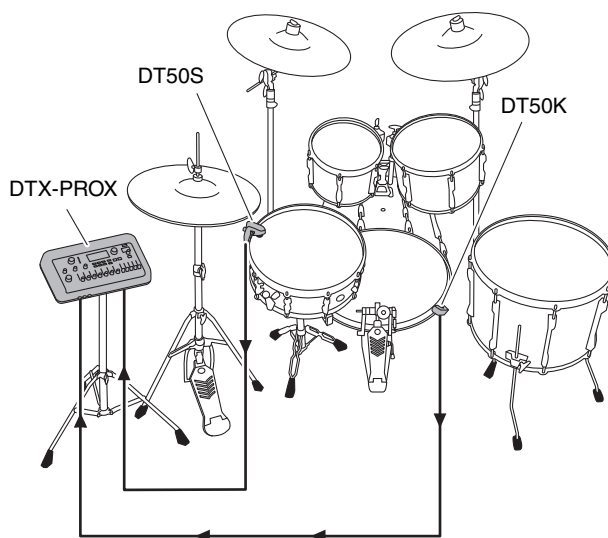
### ● Playing the DTX-PROX Using Acoustic Drums

You can attach a DT50K or DT50S Drum Trigger to the bass drum or the snare drum and connect to the [12 KICK/13] jack or the [1 SNARE] jack on the DTX-PROX to send trigger signals to your drum trigger module whenever the drum is struck. After connecting cables, set the pad type parameter. (TRIGGER/SETTING/Pad Type)

## ■ Connecting a Computer

You can connect the DTX-PROX to a computer and use DAW (Digital Audio Workstation) software such as the included Cubase AI to record your performance, edit, or mix audio.

### Precautions when using the [USB TO HOST] terminal

When connecting the computer to the [USB TO HOST] terminal, make sure to observe the following points to avoid freezing the computer and corrupting or losing the data.

#### NOTICE

- Use an AB type USB cable of less than 3 meters. USB 3.0 cables cannot be used.
- Execute the following before turning the power to the instrument on/off or plugging/unplugging the USB cable to/from the [USB TO HOST] terminal.
  - Quit any open application software on the computer.
  - Make sure that data is not being transmitted from the instrument.
- While the computer is connected to the instrument, you should wait for six seconds or more between these operations: (1) when turning the power of the instrument off then on again, or (2) when alternately connecting/disconnecting the USB cable.

If the computer or the instrument freezes, restart the application software or the computer OS, or turn the power to the instrument off then on again.
